

## *Holy Rosary Students Shine at Library's Annual Poster Contest*



Once again, several Holy Rosary third graders were in the spotlight for their award-winning poster entries at this year's "Best Book I Ever Read" poster contest. For the past 22 years, the City of Edmonds Arts Commission, in partnership with the Edmonds Library and local schools, have presented the contest to promote literature and visual art. Each year, third grade students at Edmonds schools are invited to participate by creating a poster of the best book they've ever read. School Librarians and Media Specialists (including Holy Rosary's Teresa Holt) each selected up to 20 posters to enter into the contest and a panel of judges then selected 20 Outstanding posters and 20 Honorable Mention posters. The judges evaluated posters for originality, use of color, lettering, overall design, correct spelling and creativity. The award-winning students were recognized at a ceremony at the Edmonds Library on Thursday, April 18th. Featured speakers included writer Kizzie Jones of the Daschund TALL TALES children's book series and illustrator Scott Ward. The students' posters are now being displayed in the second floor hallway in the Frances Anderson Center through May 11, 2019. The Outstanding Award recipients also each received a \$10 gift certificate to the Edmonds Bookshop.
